**NATO Formations Leads In Army Accident Prevention**

Eastern Ontario was the forefront of an important trophy presentation at Headquarters of the 4th Canadian Infantry Brigade Group, when Brigadier Donald C. Cameron of Alexandria accepted the Pearykes trophy won by our NATO formation by leading all services in vehicle accident prevention.

The 20 inch gilt and marble columned trophy was presented to the Brigade Commander by Lt. Col. T. W. Bigelow, of Ottawa, on behalf of the Minister of National Defence, Hon. George Pearykes.

The trophy, offered for an annual competition by all three services, Navy, Army and Air Forces, Research Board, was originally given to the Minister by the Automobile Transport Association for Ontario for military participation in the annual truck races.

The presentation to the head of the transport section of the Directorate of Supply and Transport, Lt. Col. R. C. Ross, was witnessed by the officer who supervises the brigade's accident prevention program, Major G. F. Ward of Halifax, NS, and three skilled drivers who were accident-free with over 10,000 miles in the past year.

Colonel Pearykes, commanding the 4th Canadian Infantry Brigade, in giving the award, stated:

"The trophy, offered for an annual competition by all three services, Navy, Army and Air Forces, Research Board, was originally given to the Minister by the Automobile Transport Association for Ontario for military participation in the annual truck races."

In congratulating Brigadier Cameron and the drivers who headed the accident prevention campaign in the army's quarter-master general Major General, R. H. Monell wrote: "That your brigade group should be able to qualify for that trophy, despite over 100 million miles travelled by your vehicles is proof indeed of a most conscientious and successful effort to achieve a high standard of driving skill. Please convey my congratulations to all those who contributed to your success."

The German accident prevention program continually stressed strict driving by drivers of the brigade and which was responsible for the 1959 war awards windshield safety stickers to the major and minor unit which establishes the best record over a three month period. It also presents careful military and civilian drivers with lapel pins and 24, 48 and 72 hour special badges. Now as long as it remains in Europe, the Pearykes trophy will honor the major unit with the best three month record.
