### Driver Examinations Start Here This Friday

Ontario Dept. of Transport, 15 Wellington St., Guelph, and examiners will be there and Mr. J. Hardy will be the senior of Guelph to teach one examiner in charge of the centre beginning Friday for the first. The Guelph office was of purpose of examining drivers recently opened for day.

The new examination will be conducted by trained uniformed personnel of the Dept. of Transport and will include a written test on Ontario's traffic laws and in future all drivers and students will practice their examinations for license applications from the Drivers' Handbook.
