

**WHAT COUNCIL DID**

**Says Heavy Duty Cars Needed for Cruisers**

Mr. J. Macklin of the Chrysler Corporation appeared before the City Council Monday night to promise consideration from his company of the large repair bills for the police cruiser cars, like taxis, preferably with automatic transmission. The Police Chairman Kelly had a case history prepared of the repair costs, and gave them to Mr. Macklin for his perusal. "Head office will analyse it," stated Mr. Macklin, "and determine if there is an element of responsibility. If there is, we will accept the responsibility."

Yearly applications for town police constable were received, opened, and turned over to the Police Committee for consideration.

A letter from E. Forgrave, Sec. Treasurer of the Georgetown High School Board, suggesting that the entrance to the school driveway should be lighted, was read to Council. Mr. Forgrave added that with the beginning of night school the need becomes more urgent. "Why don't they light their own property?" Coun. F. Hart demanded. "We'd have to change the whole pattern of lights on that street to put one there," he concluded. "Does it have to conform to a pattern?" asked Coun. Cass. "If we need an extra light, can't we put one there?" It was left with the Light Committee for a recommendation.

**Edinburgh Festival A Treasured Memory**

To Pipe Major J. Sellers of Brampton, the Lorne Scots' visit to Edinburgh will long be a cherished memory. He met and talked with Prince Philip, son of King George VI, and Captain Earl Lince of town who has returned recently from the trip.

Captain Lince stressed the fact the Lorne Scots Pipe Band were playing in a Military Tattoo, not a competition. The Tattoo is like our annual massed bands concert.

With the magnificent background of Edinburgh Castle perched high on a rock, overlooking the width of Princess Street, the Pipe Band marched through the portulaca on to the Esplanade in front of the castle, where the spectators watched. The Lorne Scots marched in the place of honour and it was so announced on the loud speaker.

The officers and band visited Inverary Castle, at the invitation of the Duke of Argyll, who was the guest of honour here a year ago. Their chartered bus went around the beautiful and celebrated Loch Lomond, and then to Glasgow.
