Comparing them with alcohol, Dr. Bell says: "The new drugs are most dangerous. Alcohol has been with us for hundreds of years, and we've managed to learn a few things about alcoholism. The new drugs bose an unknown threat."

He tells of a former alcoholle whose doctor prescribed tranquilizer pills a day lo help him overcome tenseness. "Within two months he was taking 20' pills a day. When he stopped the drug, he became very agitated and eventually had convulsions. His weight dropped from 150 to 100 pounds."

Some poople, he says, are jeopardizing their health doubly by taking large quantities of both large quantities of both alcohol and the new drugs. "The cumulative effect could be very eerious."


