Cisco Kid Will Star At Royal Winter Fair

Duncan Renaldo, known particularly to television, movie and radio fans as "The Cisco Kid," will be one of the stellar attractions at the 1960 Royal Agricultural Winter Fair to be held in the Coliseum, Toronto, November 11 to 19.

This was announced today by J. Harold Crang, president of the Royal. He indicated that "The Cisco Kid" and his famous mount, "Diablo," will be featured at the horse show during the eight evenings of the Royal as well as at five matinee performances and at two special Saturday morning shows.

The popular U.S. television and movie star has his own ranch, called the "Rancho Mission" in California and, over the years has participated in major fairs and Horse Shows on the continent.

This early childhood was spent among agricultural and cattle people in rural districts of Spain and Central Europe. It was not, however, until he began starring in motion pictures in Hollywood that he developed his horsemanship and skill to a high peak of proficiency.

One of his three children, Richard Lee, is highly interested in raising cattle. Richard is a member of a 4-H Club and has already won prizes and

trophies exhibiting his projects at Ventura County Fair. "We are delighted that Mr. Renaldo will be a star performer at this year's Royal and his participation helps to ensure the success of the Horse Show at the world's biggest, annual, indoor agricultural exhibition," Mr. Crang said in making the announcement.

Other features of the 1960 Royal will include a dazzling display of six Shetland Ponies drawing a miniature antique steam fire engine pumper and ladder wagon, a photographic competition, a children's Royal, an outstanding flower show, horse shoe pitching competition, a fashion show, and displays of rare tropical fish.

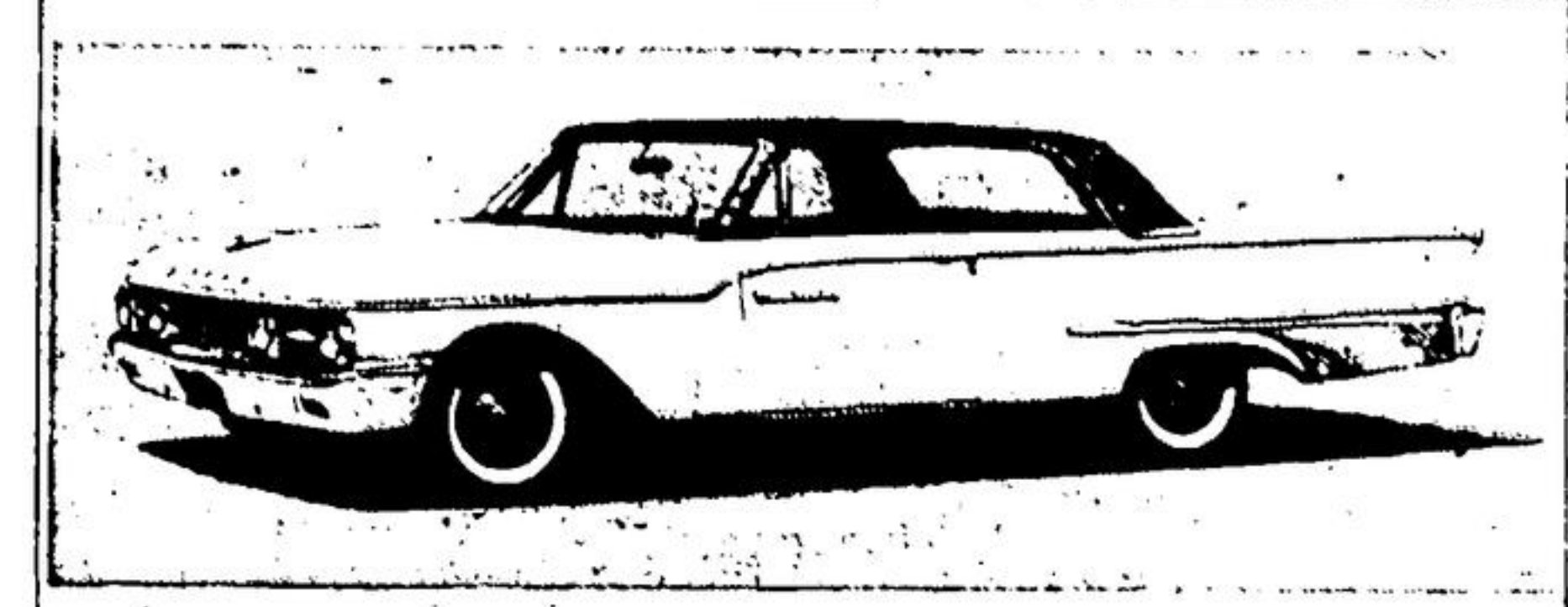
