

Aerial Attack Wins Duo In High School Football

Stealing a page out of the Argonaut play book, George town High School football team wrapped a deadly aerial attack against a Brampton Tech team here last week as they steam rolled their way to their second straight provincial win 33 to 0. The red and blue team kicked off the 1600 grid with a 21 to 1 walk over the vaunted Streetsville football team the week before.

The situation was brought into sharp focus with the extension of Windsor Road, and Deane Boulevard, through the Lane subdivision.

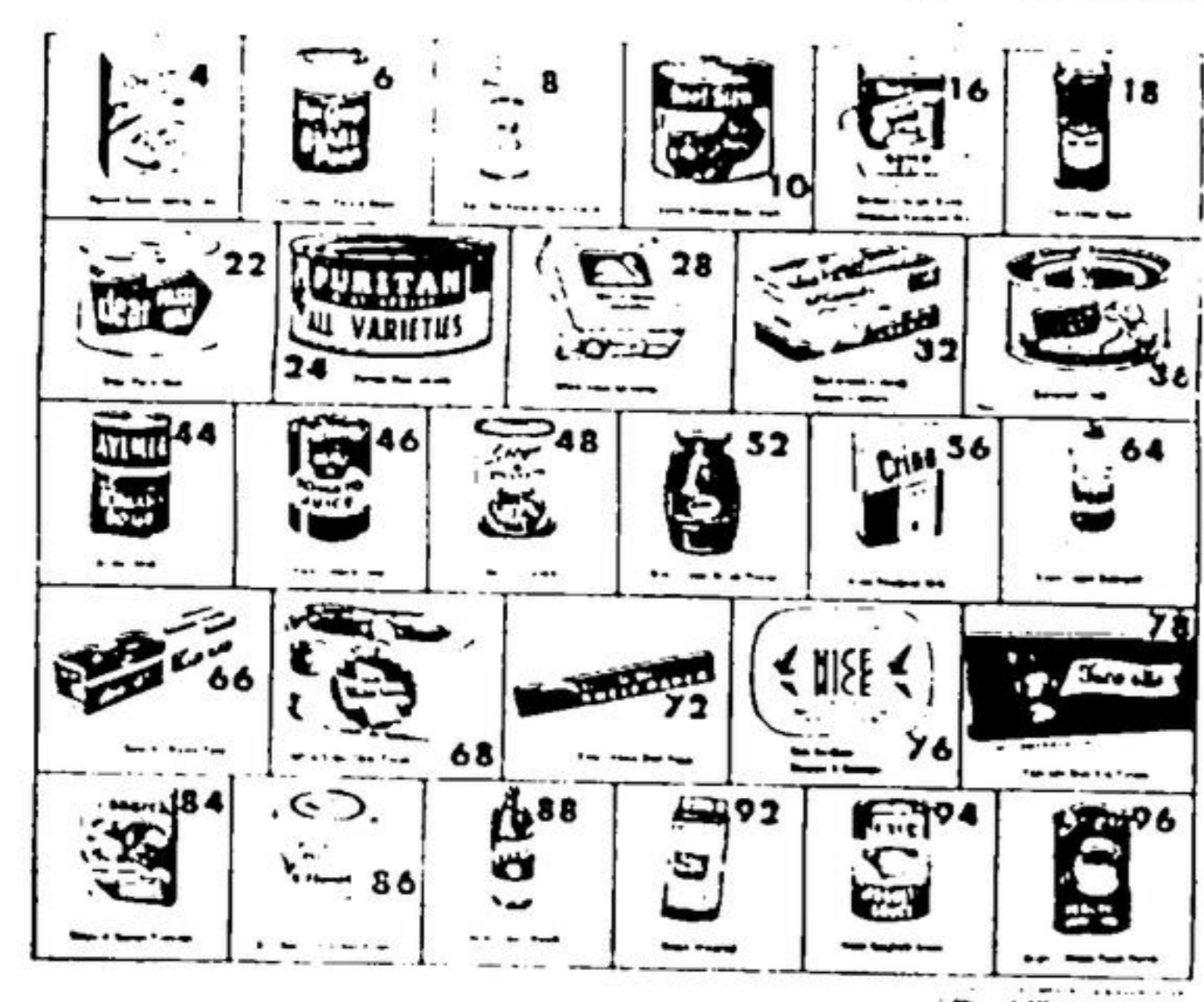
It was decided to have the assessor and engineer present a plan at the next meeting showing the direction in which the streets are numbered, and any potential street extensions.
