Halton 4-H Clubs Outstanding Year

In Halton County 4-H Club Girls and Boys completed 179 4-H Club projects in 1960. The 4-H Club programme in Ontario is directed by the Extension Branch of the Ontario Department of Agriculture, in co-operation with the Canada Department of Agriculture, and local sponsoring organizations. J. A. Francis, Agricultural Representative, and D. E. Jackson, Assistant Agricultural Representative, direct the 4-H programme in Halton County.

The Halton 4-H Club leaders' Council, with chairman A. R. Coulter, and vice-chairman John Willmott, are a group of over thirty 4-H Club Leaders who provide voluntary assistance throughout the year to the 4-H Club members in the County.

Before a 4-H Club can be organized, there must be a local sponsoring organization. In Halton there is excellent support given in all areas of the county. The Acton, George-

town, and Qhalton Agricultural Societies, as well as the Rotary Club of Milton, and the Sixteen Mile Creek Conservation Authority, provide financial assistance and facilities for the 4-H Club Members in their area.

There were eleven 4-H Clubs organized in Halton with nine eighteen 4-H animals exhibited at fairs, and 45 field crop exhibits as well as 10 Forestry Club exhibits and 4 Tractor Club Achievement Day. Eight of the eleven 4-H Clubs built Club exhibits, to demonstrate some part of their 4-H project at local fairs.

In the Calf Club project there were 41 Halton, 11 Jersey, 12 Guernsey, 3 Red Heifers, and 19 steers.

In the Swine Club, eight completed the project, with 7 Yorkshire gilts and one Landrace.

There were two new 4-H Clubs formed this year in Halton, and both of these 4-H Clubs were very successful.

The Acton - Nassagaweya 4-H Club had 13 members. The final program for 4-H this year

complete their project. This is the first year these members have been in a 4-H Club. Club and it is expected that interest shown by these members will increase their clubs in 1961.

The Halton 4-H Square Corn Club which was started to promote the growing of better square corn had 15 members complete the project. Excellent samples of silk cotton were exhibited by all members at the Georgetown Fair.

Tow 4-H Club Members have been selected from each of the 4-H Clubs in Halton to represent their County in the Provincial 4-H Inter-Club Competition being held at the Ontario Agricultural College at Guelph October 21st. The competition sponsored by the Canadian Department of Agriculture and the Ontario Department of Agriculture, gives 4-H Club Members from across the Province a chance to compete against each other. The two members chosen from each 4-H Club compete separately in the competition, and their scores are added together for the total standing. Competitions are held for members of 4-H Dairy Calf, Beef Calf, Swine, Poultry, Grain, Field Crop, Potato, Food and Tractor Clubs.
