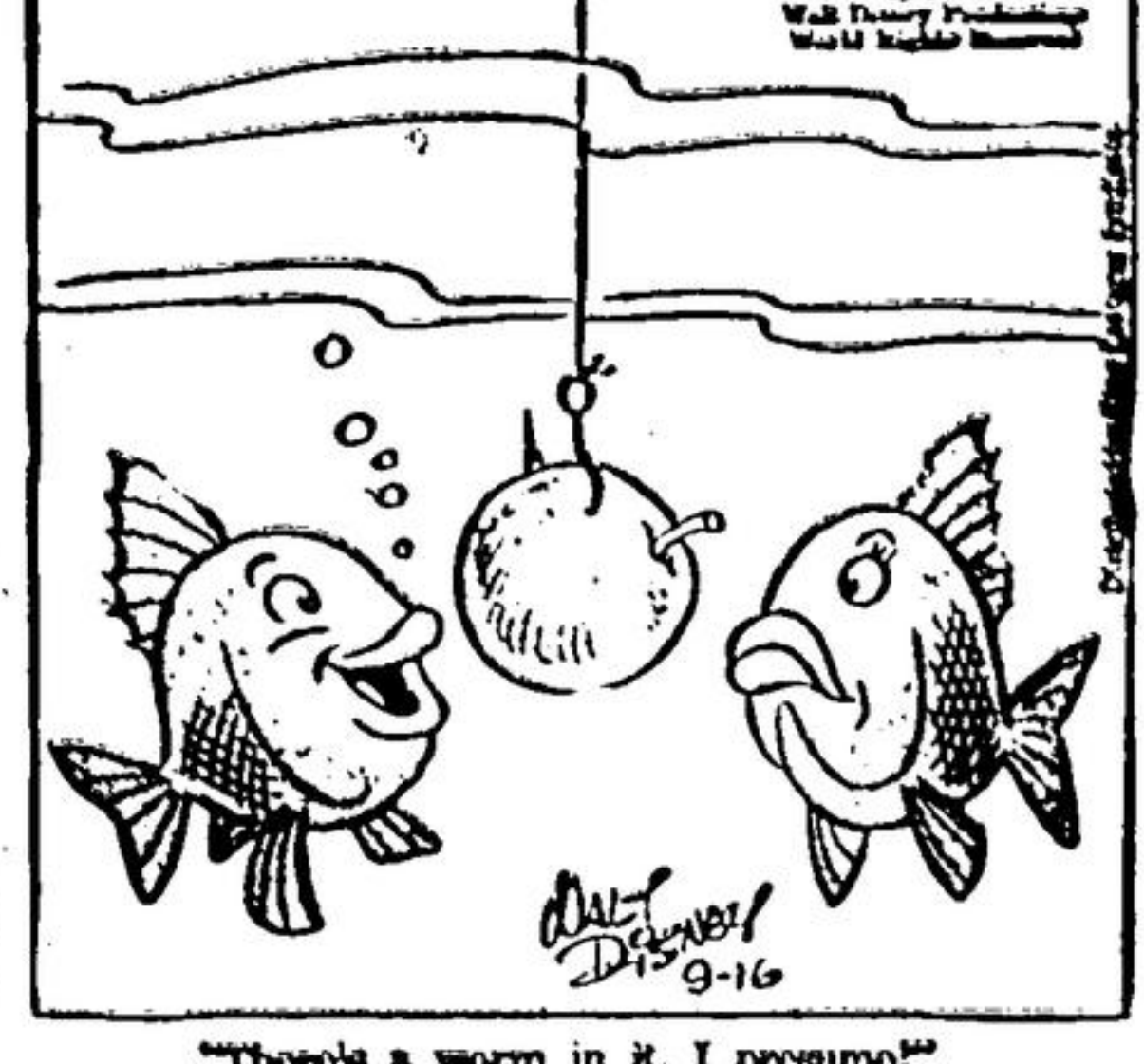
CORRECTION
