**SOEST, West Germany** — The Fifes are happy in their home. Their landlady speaks good English, and they are becoming fairly fluent in German as a consequence. This week as a young couple living "on the economy," the term used to describe accommodation rented from a German family and buying food and other needs in the German stores and markets.

Guardman M. E. Eife, Parisboro, N.S., of the 1st Battalion, Canadian Guards, and Mrs. Eife pay \$40 a month for a furnished upstairs apartment, heating it themselves, in "Little Canada," a section of Soest where several Canadian families are living. They have one bedroom, living room, kitchen and bath.

Living quarters are available for about one-half of the Canadian families here with the Army. The rest just find quarters "on the economy." This is becoming increasingly difficult, we were told, because the policy of the German government has changed. Providing considerable financial assistance for new housing, the Government states that German families and the thousands of refugees pouring in from East Germany must have first choice — after present Canadian tenants. Wash a small area, rinse it with clean water, again using a well-squeezed cloth, and wipe dry. Move on to an adjacent part and continue until the piece has been cleaned completely. And if you have new suds as they go for this work must be done carefully and quickly because water should not stay on the furniture more than a moment or two. When it has dried completely, buff it to a lustrous finish with your favourite polish.

**Fall Cleaning Starts After Summer Vacation**

How nice to be home again after the summer holidays, yet how unpleasant to contemplate all that fall cleaning! Yet it's not too difficult nor time consuming if you use the proper tools and methods as suggested by leading authorities in home care.

Cloths are not recommended for dusting walls which, no matter what the finish accumulate more dust than you might imagine. Use the wall or floor brush of your vacuum cleaner, or a soft hair wall brush, paying particular attention to corners, moldings and baseboards. Dust walls and ceilings carefully starting from the base board, after having removed your pictures and moved the furniture away from the walls.

If your walls still are grimy, test in an inconspicuous place to see if the wallpaper can be washed and, if so, always wash from the bottom up. This is important because any water that dribbles down a solid wall leaves a streak that is very difficult to remove.

Wallpapers that will not stand washing can be cleaned by one of several preparations that are sold in hardware and paint stores.

Do not use soap on enamel paints because it nearly always leaves a film.

Perhaps fall is a good time to shampoo your rugs and remove the grime that clings to the fibre and makes colors look gray, and the cutting particles of embedded grit not reached by a vacuum cleaner.

It is no longer necessary to suffer the inconvenience of sending rugs out to be cleaned professionally, or to go down on hand-and-knees with a rug shampoo and a hand brush. Long-handled applicators of the roller brush type, equipped with built-in dispensers for liquid shampoo, permit finger-tip action to spread the cleaner as a foam over the vacuumed rug. As the foam dries, solidified dirt rises to the surface and stains are loosened. After the rug has dried thoroughly — usually from three to four hours but sometimes overnight — this dirt simply is vacuumed away, leaving the nap clean and fluffy and the colours bright.

Your carpet sweeper and vacuum cleaner will do a good job of keeping your rugs in condition, although a shampoo is recommended at least every three months.

If furniture upholstery requires cleaning, you may use hand applicators for liquid shampoo that work similarly to the rug cleaner. This method also can be used on mattresses that have become dirty, although a thorough vacuum cleaning of the entire mattress surface usually is all that is necessary.

In cleaning furniture you will find that, except for de-luxe lacquered finishes such as on pianos, soap and water will not harm most finishes if used
