Another forward step in the care of the cancer patient was taken at a recent meeting of the Board of Directors of Ontario Division of the Canadian Cancer Society. Following this meeting, Mr. R. W. Robertson, president of the Ontario Division, announced that a sum of \$250,000 had been appropriated by the Division for the purchase of property in Ottawa and London for the establishment of hostels.

These hostels are designed and equipped to accommodate ambulatory cancer patients who are attending the Ontario Cancer Treatment and Research Foundation clinics in the two centres mentioned above for treatment. Their construction will mean alleviation of the 1200 shortage in both Ottawa and London which has become a dramatic acute in the past few years.
