## William Leslie Dies

Last manager of the Roxy Theatre here, and since then a manager of theatres in Acton and Trenton, William Leslie was buried in Greenwood Cemetery, Georgetown, following funeral service last Thursday at the Harold C. McClure Funeral Home.

He died in St. Joseph's Hospital, Guelph, on October 31st after a short illness.

Mr. Leslie was born in 1885 at Peterhead, Scotland. He lived in Trinidad, where he married Mercedes Salazar, later a hotelman in Georgetown, British Guiana and came to Canada in 1951. He was manager of the Roxy from 1952 until the business closed down after a disastrous fire, was transferred to Acton and last summer to Trenton with the theatre chain. He died en route to make his home in Acton.

He leaves his wife, daughters Mrs. Ben Spotts (Margaret) of Limerock, Mrs. Mercedes Salazar of Glen Williams and Heather at home, and sons William of Montreal, Alex, a student at Guelph OAC, and Brian at home. He also leaves sisters Mrs. Agnes Bruce, Mrs. Madge Davidson, Mrs. E. Smith and Mrs. I. Woolner in Seal Island and Mr. J. Johansen of Minneapolis, Minnesota, and six grandchildren.

Rev. Alex Calder conducted the funeral service on Thursday. Pallbearers were Danny Edwards, Danny Sweeney, John Dorsey, Paul Spotts and Gerald and Mac Wrong of Toronto.
