RAIDERS OBSERVE OLD CUSTOM LOSE MILTON OPENER 10-5

Tradition should not be tampered with — especially when it eventually yields success.

That was the rule Georgetown Raiders were apparently following Tuesday night when they absorbed their traditional opening game bombing from Milton Merchants in Milton to start the 1960-61 Intermediate A schedule in the Central Ontario league.

Milton started scoring early and punched goals onto the Raiders net at a merciless pace to humble their visitors 10-5.

But Georgetowners, who made up a large slice of the sparse Milton crowd, came away nodding their heads philosophically and why not, Raiders haven't been able to blast an opening game victory since natural ice.
