Interested viewers may actively participate in the series by studying the course textbook and by submitting questions to the university's Extension Department. The more pertinent questions will occasionally be dealt with on the sir by Dr. Kleerekoper. The course text book, available through the Mc-Master Book Store, is "Biology" by Claude A. Villee of Harvard University (second edition).

Dr. H Kleerekoper, who joined the McMaster faculty in 1948 is well qualified for this new teaching experiment on tele vision. He is a native of Auis terdam, Holland, where he re crived his early training. He holds MA and Ph D degrees from the University of Michi gan, and a Doctor of Science degree from the Sorbonne in

Before coming to Cauada, he taught at the University of Sau. Paulo in Brazil and carried on extensite research for the Braz dian Government' His most recent research has been on studies of the aquatic environment and segranty physiology in aquatic organisms. Grants in and from the National Research Council, the U.S. Office of Naval Research, and other agencies have enabled Dr. Kleerekoper to pursue his studies in this held. He speaks five languages and has had extensive radio ex-
