### County Councillors May Wear Blazers

Crested Blazers may be the uniform of County Council next year if preliminary steps taken this month are carried through. The City was instructed to obtain prices of 60 crests, and to drop prices on navy blue blazers.

The blazers will be purchased by the individual members. Hutton County Council on Tuesday passed a resolution from Peel County requesting an increase in its total grants from the Dominion and Provincial Governments. Hutton members of Parliament will be notified of this action.

An annual idea was brought by Rev. Fred Hyslop of Burlington. Noting that a scheme for County-wide ambulance service had been turned down by the Committee, he suggested that this be taken over by the Civil Defence Organization. "I can't think of any better service than carrying bodies of the Queen Elizabeth War," he quipped. He added that ambulance service would then be subsidized by Provincial grant.

### Offer Biology Course Via Television Station

Another television first for CHCH-TV — and a brand new outlook for higher education in Canada — will be pioneered when McMaster University's Extension Department inaugurates its first credit course over CHCH-TV. The new experiment in learning will be a course in Introductory Biology with the TV lectures delivered by Dr. Herman Kleerekoper, Professor of Zoology at McMaster. The lectures will be televised on Monday, Wednesday and Friday mornings from 7:30 to 8:00 a.m. The series, totalling 60 lectures, will run until May.

CHCH-TV officials believe the program is the first of its type to be offered by a private TV station in Canada. The classroom lectures are already being videotaped in the CHCH-TV Laboratory. Experiments are being filmed in the biology department at the university for showing during the lectures. Slides and other visual aids will be extensively used by Dr. Kleerekoper to illustrate his lectures.

According to Dr. Kleerekoper, the course will include a treatment of some of the fundamental principles in biology and discussion on cells and their properties and digestive system, the principles of muscle function, and the sensory organs. Other lectures will deal with evolution and heredity. Viewers who register for the course will also attend Saturday morning seminars at the university every three weeks and will write their examinations in June.

A \$25 fee will be charged for the course. Registration forms and a folder on the course may be obtained by writing to the Extension Department, McMaster University. Registration will be limited to 200 students. Those who pass their examinations in the TV biology course will receive credits for six units.

Dr. H. Kleerekoper, who joined the McMaster faculty in 1948, is well qualified for this new teaching experiment on television. He is a native of Amsterdam, Holland, where he received his early training. He holds M.A. and Ph.D. degrees from the University of Michigan, and a Doctor of Science degree from the Sorbonne in France.

Before coming to Canada, he taught at the University of Sao Paulo in Brazil and carried on extensive research for the Brazilian Government. His most recent research has been on studies of the aquatic environment and sensory physiology in aquatic organisms. Grants in aid from the National Research Council, the U.S. Office of Naval Research, and other agencies have enabled Dr. Kleerekoper to pursue his studies in this field. He speaks five languages and has had extensive radio experience with the International Service of the CBC.
