Fly to Holland For Television Special

Mr. and Mrs. Jacob Flikema of Norval are having a wonderful reunion with relatives in their native Holland. It all started when the Netherlands Consulate started a search for a family which would represent typical emigrants to Canada from that country. The Flikemas were chosen.

A film record has been compiled and before their departure for jet for Holland, movies were taken at their present home in Norval, at Glen Williams, Ficks of the Credit, Niagara Falls, Montreal and Quebec City in Holland, the first part of the movie will be completed and there will be a pictorial story shown on Netherlands television on Christmas Day.

Meanwhile, Mr. and Mrs. Flikema will be visiting with relatives in Godthaar, their home town in northern Holland. They plan to return home between Christmas and New Year's.
