Quick Action Averts Downtown Fire Threat

A fire threat in the downtown business section was eliminated by quick thinking on the part of fire chief Roy Bonfield Friday.

The danger developed when a faulty carburetor caused oil to flood an oil space heater in the apartment of Mr. and Mrs. Harry Knight over the Louise Beauty Shoppe, Main Street N. When flames arrived pipes and chimney were red hot from the growing flames and about to ignite.

Brigade members quickly terminated the oil flow and removed the pipes while Chief Bonfield reached the roof of the building and emptied a box of salt down the glowing chimney. The salt had a rapid cooling effect and removed the hazard.

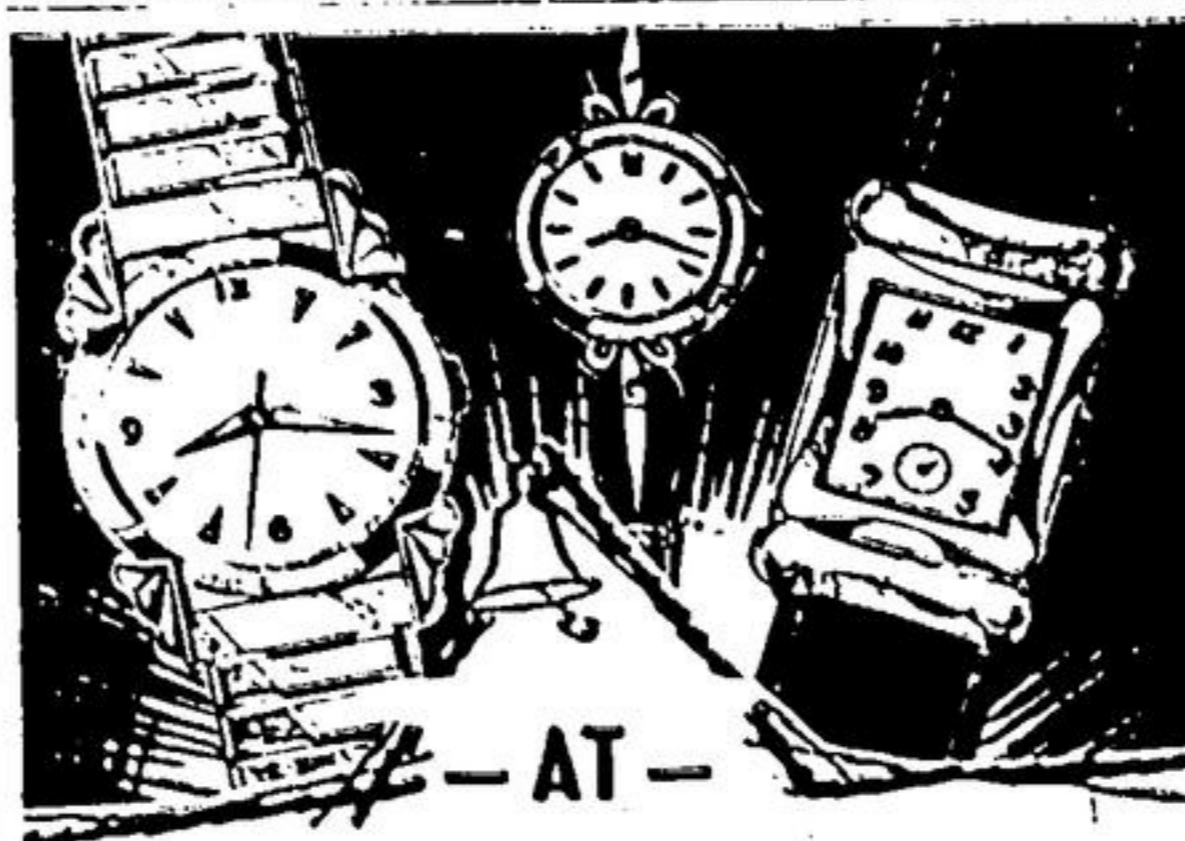

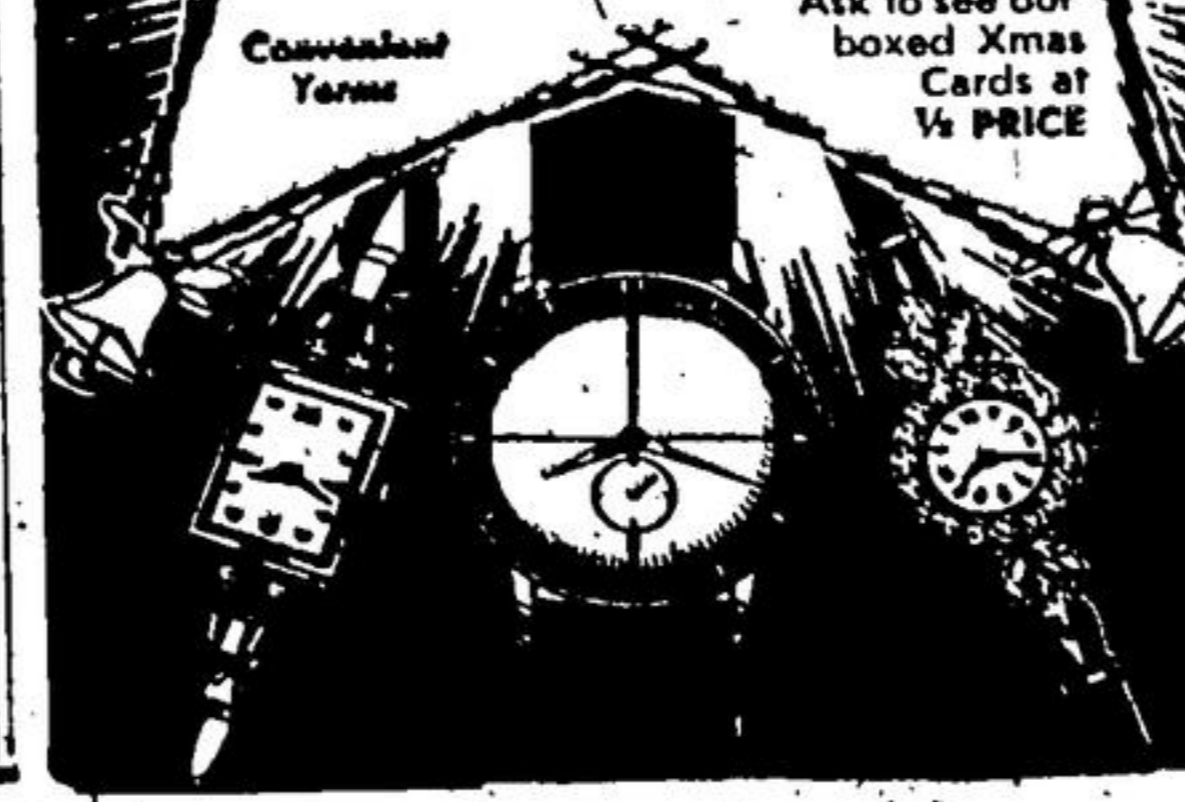
