He said Canada's problem is the need to "sell more, make things more cheaply, more rapidly and in better quality."

Port Credit sailors almost pulled Bob Demerse's party last Thursday night.

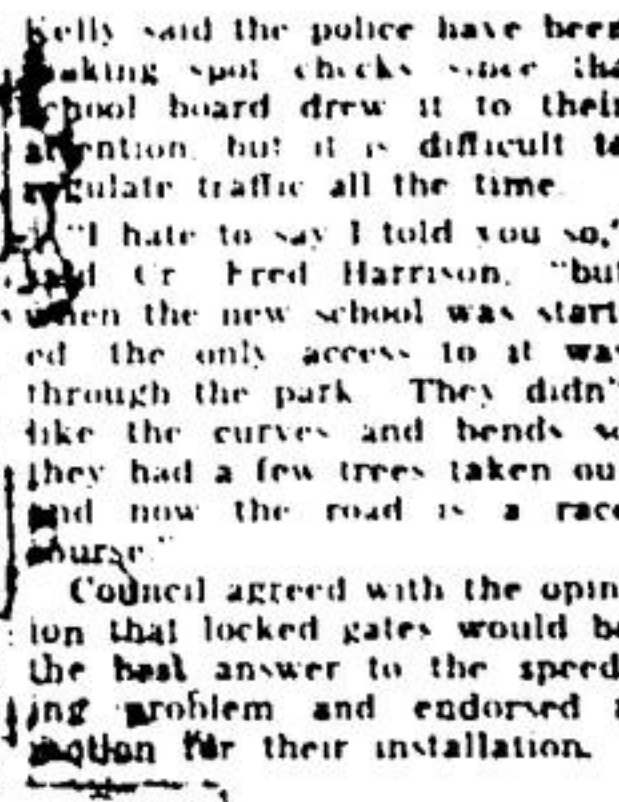
