In Scandinavian countries, the eelebration of JUL or Christmas, begins on Christmas Eve and continues for 13 days, ending with a 'twelfth night party'

Raked delicacies and sweets are abundant during the 13 days and cakes are baked in the shape of a boar recalling the ancient feasts of the Norsemen which always centred around roast boar.

Scandanavian Christmas trees are decorated with bright gold and silver stars and long strips of gaily colored paper. A small figure of a goat constructed of straw serves as a reminder of the custom of saving the last sheaf of the barvest for the magic it was supposed to pos-
