



How will you stuff your holiday turkey? One certain way of insuring a successful Christmas dinner is to include generous servings of appetizing and tempting stuffing.

No matter what method you select to cook your turkey, you will find carefully prepared so very stuffing a popular part of your menu. Turkey without stuffing is like a cake without the frosting.

Every family has a FAVORITE recipe for stuffing turkey or other fowl. We would like to share a stuffing recipe with an exciting taste, a special holiday treat.

Here's how you go about it, but be sure to remember that stuffing expands during the roasting process. So be careful not to overstuff the bird.

Wild Rice 'n' Franks Stuffing

- 1/2 cup chopped onion
- 4 tblspns. butter
- 1 cup chopped mushrooms
- 1/2 tsp. thyme
- 1/2 lb. skinless frankfurters

3 cups par-boiled wild rice
1 tsp. salt
2 beaten eggs

Note: You may use fresh, canned or dried mushrooms. Dried mushrooms should be soaked overnight and thoroughly washed before using.

Parboil wild rice until it is almost soft. Drain thoroughly. Boasting time will be sufficient to make rice completely palatable. Sauté onion in 2 table-spoons butter to light brown and set aside. Cook the mushrooms in remaining 2 table-spoons of butter for about five minutes, stirring constantly and remove from pan. Heat slightly sliced SKINLESS frankfurters in strips, and brown lightly in drippings. Remove from heat and toss all ingredients, including sausage, onion mushrooms, wild rice, beaten eggs and seasonings. Stuff bird between crop and tail. This will make about five cups, enough for a 10 pound, ready to serve turkey.

Sunshine School Building Fund Now Over \$5,000

Seek Canvassers For Georgetown

Well over \$5,000.00 to date and still pouring in! That's the current report on the North Halton Association for Retarded Children, 1960 fundraising campaign, according to president Gerry Addison.

All of the funds collected so far have been received from the town of Milton and the rural north Halton District. As noted, Milton Kiwanis club has so far raised in the largest group of donations, with \$1,000 collected in their town door to door drive. The Women's Institute of northern Halton canvassed their areas and to date have turned in \$1,000 from a list of 11 institutes participating. When the total arrives it should exceed \$2,000.

Members of the Rotary Club of Milton have been canvassing merchants and industrialists on behalf of the school building fund, and so far have turned in eight donations totalling \$1,000. Two of these were \$500 donations.

Other donations over the past week included \$117 from Mrs. O. Tennant of Campbellville, the proceeds of a concert in Brantville Hall; and a \$50 cash donation from the Holy Rosary council, Catholic Women's League.

The campaign in Acton and Georgetown has been delayed until the association for a committee willing to conduct the drive. It was reported last week that the Scottish Dance Club in Acton had agreed to host the next year's campaign.

President Addison said he was quite hopeful as to the donations to date and expressed the hope the remaining donations would swell the total even higher within the next few weeks. He also expressed his appreciation to all who are canvassing.
