Introducing Dial Phones Bolton and Caledon East

Dial telephone service will be introduced in Bolton, Castlemore and Caledon East next September. It was announced this week by Lloyd G. Denby, Bell Telephone Co. manager in this territory.

He said that two new dial switching centres will come into operation at that time to replace the present manual exchange in Bolton which now serves all three communities.

The two new exchange buildings will be in Bolton and Caledon East. Construction of the Bolton exchange building on the north side of proposed Walker Court off Highway 50, is now well advanced and should be completed by April. Upon completion crews of highly-trained technicians will begin installing the complex dial switching equipment.

The Bolton exchange, which will also serve Castlemore customers, will be equipped to provide service for some 2,900 telephones.

The whole program must be carefully coordinated so that all telephones in these communities can be switched to dual operation at the same time, and with no interruption in service.

Introduction of the two dial exchanges to serve this territory will also cause some adjustment in the present Bolton exchange boundaries.

Customers in the northwest section of the present Bolton exchange will be served from the new Caledon East exchange as will some customers now within the boundary of the Caledon Municipal Telephone System, as the Bell Telephone Co. will assume responsibility for providing telephone service to present Caledon Municipal Telephone System customers also in September. Mr. Denby added that all the customers affected by this change will be notified soon.

Toll Free

Complementing the introduction of dual Bolton customers will have toll-free calling between Caledon East and Castlemore. Caledon East customers will have toll-free calling with Bolton, Victoria and Sudgrave, and Castlemore customers will have toll-free calling with Bolton, Kleinburg.


