Fenelon Falls Tailor Started Trade in Town

Operator of a tailoring business in Fenelon Falls for over sixty years, Malcolm Hiram McCallum, 88, died in hospital at Bobcaygeon on December 30th. He was the father of Georgetown's hydro superintendent, G. W. McCallum.

Mr. McCallum was a Fenelon native, son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Robert McCallum. He had an early connection with Georgetown as it was here that he took his first tailoring job with the late A. J. Blackburn, whose store was located on Main St. in the present Norton Floral premises. He later worked in Neepawa, Manitoba, then returned east where he married Veronica Stricker of Drayton in 1896.

With his brother Harry he began a business in Fenelon Falls which is still operated there, although Mr. McCallum was forced by failing health to retire a few years ago. Three years ago he lost his eyesight.

He was a past master of the Masonic Lodge in Fenelon Falls and possessed a fifty year masonic jewel. He served a 19 year term as a member of the public school board there and had also been a village councillor.

Besides his wife and son Gerald, he leaves two brothers, Edward of Peterborough and Harry of Fenelon Falls, and a sister, Miss Sarah McCallum of Toronto.

Funeral services were conducted on Monday at the Platoon Funeral Home with interment following in the Fenelon Falls Cemetery. Among local friends who paid their respects were Police Constable Ted Scott and Mr. and Mrs. Phares Vannatter.

Halton Liberals Attend Party Rally in Ottawa

Vital questions affecting Ontario farmers, business men and labor will highlight policy discussions at the National Liberal Rally to be held in Ottawa Jan. 9th, 10th, 11th.

Nearly half the 2,000 people expected to attend the rally will be from Ontario.

Three official delegates and three alternates have been named by each federal riding Liberal Association but many of the Ontario people going to the rally are not members of any political party.

"They have been invited as liberally-minded residents of Ontario, interested in seeking solutions to these vital questions affecting their communities," said Bruce Powe, executive director of the Ontario Liberal Association.

Among those representing this area at the rally will be Maurice Manderson, QC, and Wilfrid Bird.

Twenty-one sub-committees, each assigned a different subject assigned a different subcommittee and constituency groups, and report their findings to the Convention. If approved, the resolutions will become part of official Liberal policy.

Ontario with its large representation will be well represented on the sub-committees, said Mr. Powe.

"We expect that Ontario representatives will take a particular interest in such topics as farm marketing, extension of farm credit and other agricultural problems, in unemployment, in trade, tariff policies

and taxes, in housing and in health insurance," said Mr. Powe.

Other matters to be studied in sub-committee include defence and foreign policy, federal-provincial relations, monetary policy, immigration, development of natural resources, electoral reform, national cultural institutions and labor relations.

TRAIN HITS TV TRUCK AT STATION CROSSING

Both the driver and a passenger of a van escaped serious injury when their vehicle was struck by a train at the CNR Station crossing Tuesday.

According to police Richard DeBoer, 32 Main St. N. the driver, and Fred Nydam of Stewarttown both jumped clear when the Volkswagen van in which they were riding skidded onto the tracks in the path of a work train and were out of serious danger when engine No. 4402 spun the truck around.
