

Reunion In May For Lorne Scots Regiment

Announcement of plans for the first postwar Reunion of the Lorne Scots has been received with interest by members of this great Canadian Regiment from Coast to Coast. The present Commanding Officer, Lt. Col. Arthur Kemp, CD., states that plans are well under way for the event which will be held in Brampton, location of the Militia unit's Regimental Headquarters. The two day affair is slated for Saturday and Sunday, May 6th and 7th, 1961.

One of the largest Canadian infantry units to serve in World War II, the Lorne Scots provided more than two thousand officers and men in all theatres, with the exception of the Far East. "The Lornies" had a total of 45 detached units in operation and provided a number of staff officers at National Defence Headquarters, Ottawa and Canadian Military Headquarters in London, England, as well as at headquarters of various field formations.

General Chairman of the 1939-45 Reunion Committee in charge of all arrangements for the get-together is Major Charles G. Guy, CD.

While details of the program who wear the Ansohat Camp, have still to be finalized, the present plan calls for registration to begin at 130 hours on Saturday, May 6th and a Reunion Dinner for all ranks on Saturday night. Overnight accommodation will be provided for the visitors. Sunday, May 7th, there will be a Church Parade. The 1939-45 vets will have an opportunity to see the Regiment on parade for its annual General Inspection on Sunday afternoon. For many of the visitors this will provide a real thrill as it will be the first time they will have seen the Regiment in dress uniform — a far cry from the battle-dressed familiar as the only garb worn during war time. In addition to two bands in full dress, the rank and file will parade in their Highland Green coats and kilts.

Battle Honours
Royal Assent has been given to the proposed new Queen's Colour and Regimental Colour and, it is hoped, they may be officially presented to the Lorne Scots late this year. Battle honours emblazoned on the new Regimental Colour will be Ypres 1915-17, Mount Sorrel, Somme 1916, Arras 1917-18, Hill 70, Amiens, Hindenburg Line, Pursuit to Mons, Sicily 1943, Italy 1943-45, Northwest Europe 1944-45.

Also to be incorporated in the Regimental Colour will be the new Lorne Scots Motto in Gaelic "Air Son Ar Duthcheas" — which means "For Our Heritage."

Big Plans Afoot Sportsland Park

Details of a large-scale estate transaction involving 150 acres of property near the junction of Highways 7 and 400 and costing in excess of \$600,000 were announced this week by Gerald A. Black, President of Gerald A. Black Real Estate Ltd., Toronto.

The property, formerly known as Maryland Gardens and containing the world's largest swimming pool, has just been acquired by a newly formed group known as Sportsland Park Ltd.

The new group of owners under the presidency of T. Alec Rigby will continue to operate the playground area. Immediate improvements to existing facilities and expansion over an extended period of time will cost well over \$1,000,000.

A prominent amusement park designer from California has been retained to work with local architects in designing the new Sportsland Park so that it will eventually be one of the greatest amusement areas of its kind in North America. Mr. Black told the press.

The officials of Sportsland Park plan to begin operation by the weekend of May 24 in addition to the world's largest swimming pool there will be
