## Says R. C. Laity Should Take More Responsibility

On Sunday, March 12th, the annual C.W.L. luncheon was held in the church basement, The 5th, Company Holy Cross, Georgetown, Girl Guides prepared the delicious menu, under the guidance of their Captain, Mrs. R. Freeman and Lieutenant, Mrs. J. Pignatelli.

Mrs. George Walker, league president, addressed the meeting and welcomed the guest speaker, Sister Gabriella, of the Sisters of Social Service in Hamilton, and two representatives of Acton C.W.L.

Mrs. Walker congratulated the Girl Guides for the wonderful lunch and Kitty Strite, Patrol Leader, responded, expressing the Guides' pleasure in serving the league.

Father Otger presented Mrs. E. Tyers with a "Past President's Pin" and Mrs. F. Tucker will also receive a pin at a later date, as she was unable to attend the luncheon.

Speaking to the assembly, Sister Gabriella noted and admired the new Liturgical Altars in the church, saying that the church is moving rapidly in the right direction.

Her address dealt with the work of the Lay Apostolate in present times. Stressing the first Christian Unity, Sister pointed out that "We are the Church." We should bear a family likeness to the first Christians who did things together, not for themselves, but for others. Graces are distributed gradually and we must share in the work to bring them to one another.

The Laity today can and should take on more responsibility, in order to relieve the religious tasks which can be fulfilled by lay men and women leaving Nuns free for service in foreign missions and other similar fields.

Adding that during the present day one cannot avoid commercials, Sister urged everyone to make a closed retreat in order to further their union with God.

Mrs. D. Sargent thanked Sister for her very interesting speech.

Father Otger said that he felt that Sister had made a great impression and that her words should be accepted readily, as she practises them in her daily life.

Jim Blair scored twice, from Al Blair both times. Blair scored once from Lane and Bennett, Mike Cummins from A. Blair and Lane, and Terry Lane from Al Blair as Burlington failed to answer.

In the first game Al Blair scored four goals and Jim Blair and Mike Cummins once each to tie.
