WHAT COUNCIL DID
Council Votes \$1140 to Repair Job for Truck

A major repair job was voted for the town's 5-year-old Intransit truck by council Monday. Bids had been asked from three firms, and an \$1140 bid from Scott Motors was accepted for the job which will include a new engine. Recapping of two front tires for \$80 was also voted.

The move was opposed by Reeve Sargent who said it is not long range economy to spend so much money on an old vehicle. "It's a good truck and can give us lots of service yet," was Mayor Hyde's opinion. The truck will not be used for snow plowing, he said, which had perhaps contributed to its present shape.

"I'll support the repairs with crossed fingers," said Cr. Cass and Cr. Wm. F. Hunter echoed his sentiments. Finance Chairman John El Jott said the town is in no position to foot the cost of a \$7,000 new truck this year, nor would it be any easier to find \$5500 for a smaller truck as the Reeve suggested.
