## "March Moods" Colourful Presentation By School

The "Sorry, Sold Out," sign had to be displayed on Friday evening, March 24, when Georgetown Public School presented "March Moods" before a capacity audience in the auditorium of Howard Wrigglesworth Public School.

"March Moods" is a variety programme of music, drama, acrobatics, dancing and a drill. It was the first entertainment presented by Georgetown's newest public school and the audience showed their approval by the sustained applause and many fine compliments accorded the various items on the programme.

Mr. W. E. Wilson, chairman of the public school board, was chairman. In his opening remarks, he welcomed those present and expressed the board's endorsement of school functions of this nature.

The programme opened with the junior choir, comprising seventy pupils from grades 1, 2, 3, and 4, rendering six numbers: "My Mocking Bird," "Timothy Lee," "The Robins," "The Bare Footed Maiden," "The Little Ship," and "Peter Cottontail."

The kindergarten operetta, "If We Had Wings," was warmly received as the tiny tots displayed their singing and acting abilities.

"The Singing Sixes and Sevens," pupils of Grades 1 and 2 sang a selection of six numbers: "Nut Tree," "My Cookie Man," "Tommy Stout," "Spring," "If I Were a Bunny," and "Easter Bunny."

Dramatization of the well-known fable, "The Three Little Pigs," by Grade 1 gave a new and somewhat humorous reality to this old tale.

An Irish medley comprising "My Wild Irish Rose," "The Rose of Tralee," "In a Shanty in Old Shanty Town," "That's an Irish Lullaby," "Gockles and Mussels," and "Where the River Shannon Flows" by the

Grade 8 class was the "March Moods" tribute to St. Patrick's Day. Solo parts by Tanis Helliwell and Barbara Hildebrandt were accorded special acclaim.

A colourful drill, "Balloon Drill," was performed by pupils of the Grade 2 and 3 class accompanied by Mr. Harrison on the piano.

"Marianina," "Feathery Snow," "Down in Hawaii," "Zither and Lute" and "Bendemeer's Stream," were choral selections done in three parts by the pupils of Grades 6 and 7.

Grades 3 and 4 demonstrated their acting abilities when they staged "The Capture of the Easter Rabbit."

Vocal selections by Grade 6 included, "Santa Lucia," "The Mill," "Were I a Bird," "The Time to Sing" and "Worship."

The pupils of Grades 4 and 5 staged a demonstration of tumbling and other aspects of physical education.

Three part singing by a group of eighteen Grade 8 pupils, unaccompanied and featuring bass voices included, "Music in the Air," "Old Folks at Home," and "Vive L'Amour."

Toes were set to tapping when two sets of Grades Six and Seven took the stage to perform a square dance.

"Henry's Mail Order Wife," a comedy in which Grade Eight pupils David Howard, Fred Howe, Terence Peters, Janice Baker, Carol Fournier, and James English had roles, had the auditorium filled with roars of laughter.

Concluding the programme, the senior choir of one hundred and twenty pupils from grades 4, 5, 6, 7, and 8 sang in three parts, "Christ Is Risen," "Morn's Roseate Hues," "Battle Hymn of the Republic" and "God Save the Queen."
