Speaks to Throne Address

It is a pleasure for me to have the opportunity of speaking on the Throne address. It has been my pleasure to represent the county of Halton continuously for the past sixteen years in this Assembly.

During the years that I have been a member of this Assembly, I have watched a lot of members come and go. Today, there are just ten members in this Assembly during the session of 1961.

WE HAVE in this assembly a small remnant of the Liberal party making a feeble effort to fill the position of Her Majesty's Loyal Opposition in this Assembly, just a small shadow of what was once the Liberal party.

THE ARTIFICIAL INSEMINATION ACT: This Act came into effect in 1947. It provides assistance to A.I. units including grants and licensing of technicians.

26,372 miles of rural hydro lines have been installed. These lines serve about 340,000 new farm and hamlet dwellers. Over \$95 million for bonusing the cost of rural line construction has been paid out under this government, from the provincial treasury.
