

thing of the different kinds of fish that are found in Ontario Elmira and across Canada. As trout season is the first to open, I'll start with the Brook trout. This is a jewel among game fish. Hardly a colour in the spectrum won't be found on him. And most anglers cannot say whether they like catching him or eating him more. In Canada the brook trout ranges from the Maritime provinces half way across the continent to the Strathroy Nipigon and Lake Superior shores, thence through far north Exeter ern Ontario, Manitoba, Quebec, Newfoundland and Labrador to the Hudson Bay and Arctic waters. In the lakes and rivers of Northern Quebec and Ontario it grows to six pounds and up. Strathroy 5 - Elmira 0
