**Off Again, On Again Teen Dance Hits Snag**

Club Midtown's annual spring dance will proceed as planned this Friday night in the arena Rose Room.

But it had a few hurdles to overcome before plans were finalized on Tuesday.

The club had been planning the event, to which parents and adult friends are invited, for some time and had engaged the Debonaires Orchestra to play and issued advertising posters.

Last week it was found there was a conflict in bookings and the Raiders hockey club had also engaged the Rose Room for the same evening.

A delegation from the club visited council on Monday and with Mike Willingham as spokesman, explained their problem.

While they got a sympathetic hearing, council declined to interfere in the work of the Board of Parks Management and suggested the delegation visit the board meeting which was taking place the same evening.

Mr. Willingham said the club has had a gentleman's agreement with the board for Friday nights, except when given reasonable notice that the hall will be rented to other groups.

In this case, he did not feel sufficient notice had been given and he urged that in future a written agreement be made between the club and board.

Termining the mix up "unfortunate" Mayor Hyde explained that council has no right to interfere with board matters.

The parks board is doing a fine job of managing the arena and trying to make it pay its way, and he felt that the delegation would have a good hearing. At present there is consideration being given to putting a summer surface in the arena proper, and this could be an advantage to Club Midtown, he said.

Mr. Jun Emmerson wondered if the hockey club could not postpone its dance a week, while Deputy Reeve John Elliott thought council's recreation committee should take a hand in the decision, as the parks board gets \$14,000 of the taxpayers' money in grants each year.

"There seems to have been several 'rhubarb' lately and if we could help the board avoid these they would be happy too, I think," said Reeve Sargent.

The delegation later talked with the parks board and an amicable solution was arranged for future Fridays, although the

board stood by its decision to reserve this Friday for the hockey club.

However, on Tuesday morning, hockey club officials decided to defer to the teeners and changed their dance date to April 28th.

A hurried conference at noon found the Midtown executive reverting to their original plan and the dance is on this Friday.
