During the October fire prevention week, the fire brigades in each Halton municipality plan to hold open houses and the classrooms bringing the highest percentage attendance of children and parents will win a beautiful trophy for their school. Earlier in the school term children will receive home fire hazard checksheets, and these will be filled in by the parents and returned to the fire brigades at the open




