Weed Control News

Dandellon is one of the most common and best known weeds and this year seems to be particularly good one for these little yellow pests. Weed Inspecters receive nuermous calls from residents, each spring, complaining about the neglected dandelions on the neighbour's lawns. But no matter how legitimate the complaints may be we cannot force anyone to destroy their dandelions, as this variety has not been included among the weeds listed as noxious in the Ontario Weed Control Act.

Dandelions are very sensitive to 2. 4D amine, which if applied at the right time and in the proper concentration, kills not only the leaves and stems but also the roots and so prevents regeneration. Careless use of the chemical however can result in damage to flowers and ornamental shrubs.
