WHAT COUNCIL DID

Delinquent Taxpayers May Lose Property

Delinquent taxpayers may be faced with loss of their property if council implements provisions in Halton County to take over property on which taxes are owing.

At Monday's council meeting, Mayor Hyde said it has been learned that under a tax registration procedure allowed by the Department of Municipal Affairs Act, at the end of two years of tax arrears, vacant property can be registered in the name of the town; and built-up property at the end of three years.

Ownership — After a year of registration if taxes are not paid, the town assumes ownership. During the year, if an owner wishes to reclaim his property, he must pay all taxes, penalties and interest, plus 10% of taxes owing as an extra.

There are only a few counties which come under this legislation, the mayor said.

It is more usual procedure to use the tax sale method, by which, when property is sold, the town claims what is owing and the property owner gets any balance.

"It throws a whole new light on action which our finance committee might take," he said.

Discuss New Courses For Fall Night School

Courses which might be offered at Georgetown Night School this fall were discussed at a meeting of the night school committee at the home of Miss Dorothy Stone last week.

Furniture refinishng, lamp shade making, picture framing, interior decorating, green thumb gardening and aluminum etching are some of the possibilities. Courses are dependent on getting qualified teachers, and then in having enough people register to make a course possible.
