## Conservation Authority Seeks Plan For New Kelso Dam Project

Members of the Sixteen-Mile Creek Conservation Authority have asked a Toronto engineering firm to draft a master plan of the new Kelso Conservation Area, site of the \$332,000 Kelso dam.

**Master Plan**

At a recent meeting requests to establish a sportsmen's clubhouse, Girl Guide camp and Boy Scout camping area were filed pending arrival of the report from R. K. Kilborn and Associates. The master plan will design the layout of the new water storage dam, roads, recreational site, swimming and boating area, buildings, and use of buildings, and the site of the ski club.

The Authority has recently been offered two ponds at Campbellville for a price of \$3,000 and following preliminary studies, the Authority has agreed to take up an option providing a public road adjacent to the main pond can be closed from traffic. The main pond lies between the Guelph Line, C.P.R. tracks and Peach Ave., and the Authority plans to raise the water level at a cost of \$250. The second pond lies south of the large pond, just below the railway tracks.

Recently 100 sets of conservation pictures and 100 copies of the booklet "Progress and Achievements" have been purchased for the use of the public relations advisory board. Distribution will be to schools, organizations and interested individuals.

The Authority has authorized a committee of Dr. C. A. Marshall, Allan Day, and Archie Service to meet with Halton County Council's agricultural committee to draft an agreement for the use of the Duff Alexander farm at the Kelso Conservation Area as a county museum. Preliminary talks have been held and it has been decided to use a large barn on the property as a museum site.

A tri-agency was recently formed to co-ordinate the activities of the Sixteen, Twelve and Spencer Creek Conservation Authorities. Representatives of these three authorities, which work out of the one office in Milton, will meet regularly to discuss such common subjects as personnel and purchasing of equipment. Dr. Martin, and Chairman Robert Marshall are the Sixteen-Mile representatives to the tri-agency.

## Holiday for Mothers Is New Party Plank

Saturday, June 3rd, the Halton mothers received unanimous support for the New Party resolutions from New Party Clubs, union locals, and CCF members were presented for discussion. A lively and enthusiastic assembly debated more than fifteen resolutions which expressed a variety of views of modern political and economic problems.

The delegates who were assembled in the Steelworkers' Hall in Milton, after a lengthy morning session, adjourned for a brief lunch and hurriedly returned to continue the vigorous debate which lasted till 5 p.m.

A resolution favouring government support for a national plan for annual holidays for

mothers received unanimous support. The forum stressed that as women have won the right to vote, so mothers should have the right to an annual vacation which men already enjoy.

A union delegate expressed concern for the difficulty many New Canadians encounter in adjusting to Canadian society. He proposed that a Department of Cultural Affairs be established to assist in the alleviation of this problem and to also encourage the mutual appreciation of the various cultural and racial groups.

The delegates attending the meeting included members from the teaching and law professions as well as local trade union representatives.
