Cost of Proposed County Buildings Cut \$376,000

Estimated Expense Will Be \$924,000

\$376,000 was shaved off the cost of the proposed County Buildings last week, when Architect W. Armstrong submitted a second set of plans to County Council.

The first estimate of \$1,300,000 without furnishings, was deemed too high by County Council, and the architect was asked to cut the cost. The present estimated cost is \$924,000.

All Structural action on the building, a motion to accept the plan was passed unanimously.

Current Revenue "With Halton's debt standing at \$3,342,495, I would like to suggest the building be paid out of current revenue over the next 3 or 4 years," said Reeve I. Ryckman of Burlington.
