### Budget \$732 For Work Of Prevention Bureau

A 1961 budget of \$732 for the promotion of fire prevention throughout Halton County was established last week by the Halton Fire Prevention Bureau. Items in the budget include trophies for a school competition, a banquet for winners of the annual school fire prevention poster contest, literature, publicity, a dinner for an insurance inspectors' blitz, the Christmas fire-safe campaign and miscellaneous office expense.

Fire Prevention Bureau members endorsed a letter condemning the use of a photo showing a serious fire hazard in a large national circulation magazine. The farming magazine had photographed a poor example of a pig hatcher heat lamp in a feature story on a New Brunswick farmer, and members agreed to draw the fire hazard to the magazine's attention.

Chief Doug Wilson of Oakville reported the Bureau received many fine comments on the farm fire safety film strip and firefighting equipment demonstration given at a recent 4-H club parents' night in Milton. He said the crowd was pleased with the Bureau's part in the program, and reminded members that the photos are available for other farm group meetings.

## Peninsular Tour for Kennedy Grade Eight

On the foggy morning of Friday, June 9th, the grade 7 and eight pupils of George Kennedy public school had the privilege of going on a bus tour to the famous Niagara district.

**Fifty-Five Pupils**  
We left the school at 7:45 a.m. Since the group included fifty five pupils and four teachers some had to go along in a car. Mr. Pinkerton, the Grade 7 teacher, took five pupils in his car, while Mr. Allen, the principal, Mr. Harrison, our music teacher, and Mrs. O'Malley, the grade 6 teacher, supervised the pupils on the bus.

**Botanical Gardens**  
Our first stop of interest was the Royal Botanical Gardens at Hamilton. Here we had twenty minutes to wander around, take pictures and admire the beautiful scenic grounds and gardens before boarding the bus for Stoney Creek.

**Farthest Point**  
At Stoney Creek we visited the monument which now commemorates the war of 1812-1814. It is the farthest point to which the British were driven and is said to be the turning point of the war.

**Interesting Hour**  
Just before 11 a.m. we arrived at Niagara Museum where we spent a most interesting hour. This museum, formerly on the American side, is now a centre of great interest to many visitors with its odd specimens of freaks of nature and stuffed birds and animals. There were also many other items of interest here.

**Wax Museum**  
Our next stop was at Victoria Park where we ate our lunch and were given an hour or so to roam about on our own. Some spent their time on a visit to the scenic tunnels, others went to the wax museum, while still others strolled about viewing the roaring cascading waters of the falls and buying souvenirs.

**Aero Car**

**British Cause**  
On the heights of Queenston we visited the famous 'Brock's Monument.' This one hundred eighty five foot memorial was built in memory of General Brock, who during the war of 1812, was killed in action, while fighting for the British cause.

His body is buried inside this memorial. Many of the more energetic pupils climbed this towering monument to the height of some hundred and sixty feet. Also at Queenston is the Laura Secord Monument, built to commemorate her well-known walk to Beaver Dams to warn Col. Fitzgibbon of the American 'plan.'

**Original Building**  
We then proceeded to Fort George where a guide took us through the various buildings inside the Fort. All buildings have been restored to their original plans except the powder magazine which is still the original building. Each of the buildings proved to have something of interest. After visiting the museum we again boarded a bus and went on our way.

**Twin Locks**  
Enroute to the Thorold Locks

we went through the village of Niagara-on-the-Lake and saw some of the beautiful colonial buildings which once belonged to the government officials.

At Thorold we saw some vessels going through one of the twin locks. It was quite interesting and educational watching the freighters rise with the water and seeing them go thru the locks.

Although we had had a wonderful day, I'm sure we were all glad when we started off for home as we all were feeling rather tired.

Our last stop before arriving home was at Burlington where we stopped to have a bite to eat. By now we were rather hungry, again. At 9:40 p.m. the pupils and teachers were back at their point of departure. I am sure that this trip will be remembered by all who participated, not only as an enjoyable trip but also as an educational one.
