Prominent Conservative Served in Two Wars

The town of Milton lost a well known and highly respected citizen on Thursday, June 15th, when Major Frederick William Bruce Fitzgerald died. Born and educated in Millbrook, Mr. Fitzgerald went overseas with the 75th Battalion in the First World War, and on returning from the conflict, joined the staff of the Bank of Toronto. He worked in numerous branches before coming to Milton to found the F. W. B. Fitzgerald Insurance Agency, which he managed until his sudden death, except for a few years during the Second World War when he was overseas as adjutant to the Canadian Dental Corps. He was awarded the MBE.

Very Active Mr. Fitzgerald was always very active in all phases of community life. Before coming to Milton, he was past master of Lansdowne Masonic Lodge. Here he was secretary of the Halton County Conservative Association for over twenty years, and took an active part in all phases of the work. He was one of the first members of the North Halton High School District Board, the treasurer and an active member of Grace Anglican Church, returning officer in recent Provincial elections, secretary of Milton District Hospital since its inception, and he worked

closely with the local police as Justice of the Peace for several years.

He is survived by his wife, Orpha McClenahan and daughter, Mrs. W. J. Duignan, (Elizabeth Anne) of Milton, also a sister Miss Matilda Fitzgerald of Toronto.
