Bahai's Commemorate Martyrdom of the Bab

On July 9th, the Bahai's of Georgetown will observe one of their most sacred anniversaries, the Martyrdom of the Bab.

Religious Ideals

111 years ago this youthful forerunner of the Bahai World Faith named Ali Muhammad, known to the world as the Bab on "The Gate," was publicly executed in the city of Tahriz, Iran, in a fruitless effort to destroy the religious ideals he had spread throughout the country. Among these are the need for a universal language, universal education, the duty of all faiths to unite in establishing universal peace, the moral responsibility of governments to protect human rights, and the obligation of all men

to engage in useful work.

Intensified Message

His martyrdom intensified his message among the people. From Persia his teachings were carried to Baghdad, Palestine, Europe, the Americas and the Far East. Thus all around the world Bahai's will join in commemorating the martyrdom in prayer and meditation.

As a fitting memorial to this heroic youth, a beautiful shrine is erected on the slopes of Mount Carmel at Haifa, Israel, the international headquarters of the Bahai World Faith.

Local Service

The late Mr. Sutherland Maxwell, a Montreal architect, was responsible for the design of this shrine and the work was carried on under his direction.
