Frid Construction, Hamilton, was in charge of building the sewage treatment plant and auxiliary buildings, which have been located on part of the former W. T. Craig Reid farm, East End Elevators, Toronto, built the sanitary trunk sewer and Harlock - Schulz Electric Ltd., Galt, the electric controls.

Proctor & Redfern, Toronto, were consulting engineers.

S. Buszynski was in charge of construction for the Ontario Water Resources Commission and B. G. Porter, plant operations.

Serving a population of up to 15,000, the plant can handle a million and a half gallons a day.

Dr. Charles Best Lectures In England, Continent

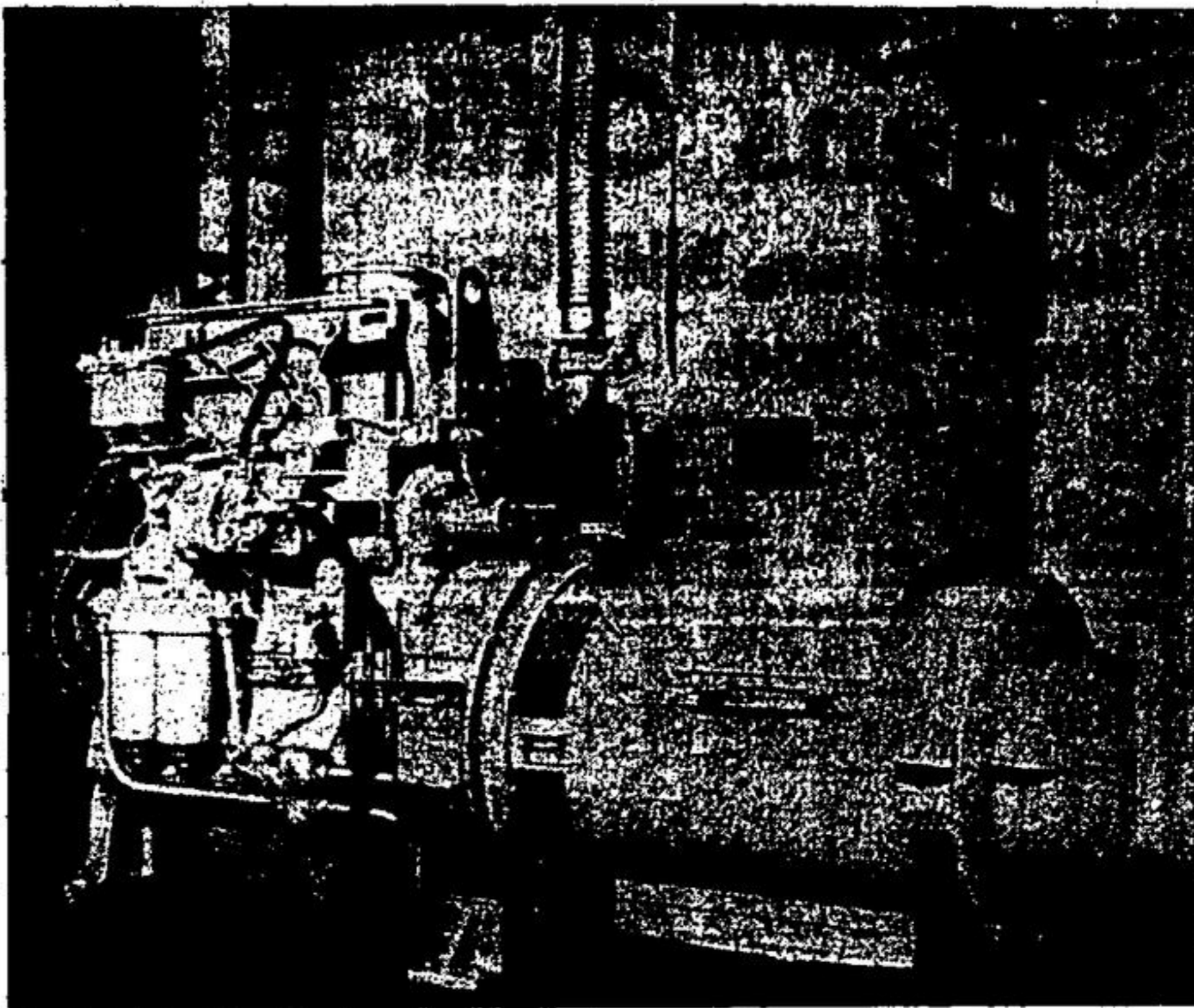
Father of Halton MP, Sandy Best, is in Europe on a lecture tour once again.

The head of the Banting Best Institute in Toronto spends a great deal of his time travelling and lecturing on research as carried out at the Research Foundation in Toronto which bears his name.

Last winter Dr. Best spoke in many countries in Europe and climaxed it with a tour and lectures in Israel. By coincidence, another Georgetown man, Ken McMillan, at that time the president of the OHA, was in Sweden at the same time as the Dr. and stayed at the same hotel.

Dr. Best is well known in town to older residents, having played hardball here in his college days, and worked at what is now the North Halton Golf & Country Club, prior to his discovery of insulin, with Dr. Banting.
