Track Club Looks Good In Debut at Hamilton Georgetown's new track aggregation sent seven people to the Hamilton Athletic meet last Wednesday night, and despite the experienced competition none of the seven looked uncomfortable while rubbing shoulders with the fast crowd. Placed Well Up Ted Quackenbush, one of the Track Club organizers, told the Herald last week that in some cases the Georgetown runners were as much as five years younger than their competition, but shrugged off the handicap to place well up at the finish line. He said that the locals lacked the training necessary to carry off a win there. Six girls, Betty and Lesley Quackenbush, Gloria Jones, Anne Peterson, Cheryl Myers and Judy Arthur, and two boys Barry Harvey and David McLeod made up the Georgetown delegation. First 100 Yards Lesley took a third in the 100 yard sprint for 14 and under, the first time that she had attempted that distance, while Betty grabbed a 4th in the same distance. Though Gloria, Judy and Cheryl ran well, the lack of training held them out of the top spots. Barry and Dave both tried the men's 100 yards. Dave got up to take third and Barry, running without track spikes, was seventh across the tape. Sets Personal Mark Dave, who is just 15, stuck around to nab 2nd in the high jump setting a new personal mark of 5'7". The club trains at the high school Mondays and Thursdays but may shortly step up their programs to three nights a week. The Ontario Athletic Commission helped the cause last week with a shipment of jumping standards, discus, shot put and javelin. Membership is currently in the neighbourhood of 15 and more are invited.
