Concrete Dividers Replace Sand Bags

Unlatched sand bags at the Rexway Highway corner will disappear during surfacing of streets in the East Georgetown area.

The sandbags have been used in an experiment to make a safer highway exit for traffic at the wide intersection. With Rexway slated for a prime and chip treatment, concrete dividers will replace the sandbags. The concrete dividers will be placed in two lanes, presently also separated by sandbags will now have a painted divider, council decided Monday during a discussion.

Reeve Doug Sargent said surface treatment had started last week and three roads have been completed. Unfortunately, a stone crusher broke down and caused a delay which was further aggravated by rainy weather. The contractor hopes to be back to work later this week.
