

WHAT COUNCIL DID

**Claims Raw Sewage
Hurts Land Revenue**

Raw sewage from Georgetown spilling into the west branch of the Credit River near the new disposal plant and is causing loss of revenue for his property at Norval, Ray Pomroy told council Monday in a letter.

The condition has been endured for four years, he said, and he wants immediate action to correct this.

The situation, which council claims is caused by a sewage lagoon, privately constructed on Delrex land by an agreement between Delrex Developments and the Ontario Water Resources Commission, is one which must be dealt with by those two groups, said Mayor Hyde and the letter was ordered forwarded to the OWRC.

Contaminating
"It appears that the lagoon is the only thing now contaminating the river," he said.

Town engineer G. R. Bligh said he understands the Delrex firm is repairing a broken pipe to the lagoon at present.

Another Norval property, Willow Park, is affected by the situation, and wording of a sign placed by the proprietor drew objections from Cr. Bob Burke, who thought the idea of the sign was proper, but that it could be lettered in somewhat different words. Council agreed to contact officials about the wording.

A letter from Dr. Berry, general manager of the Water Resources Commission, commended council on the fine arrangements and the program for the final opening of the new sewage disposal plant recently.

Mayor Hyde in turn expressed thanks to Cr. Don Barrager who headed the committee in charge.

A further opportunity to have taxpayers view the new plant will be given on August 20th when it is planned to have the buildings open all day for inspection.

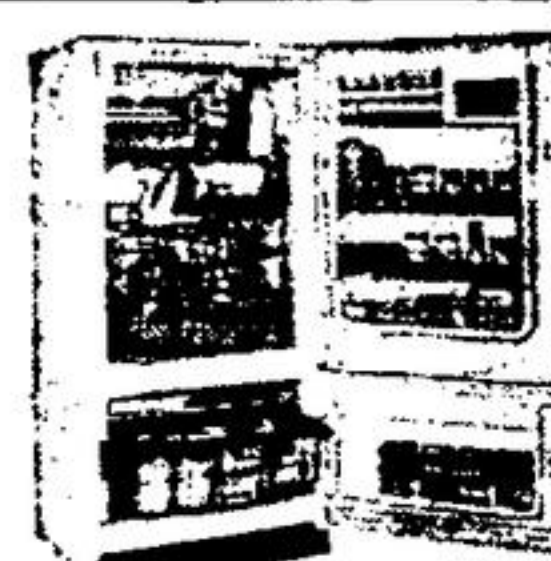
