Can Balance Budget With Rigid Control
Town auditor Walter Pope was cautious when questioned forby council Tuesday about the chances for a balanced budget at year-end.
"We're within \$1,000 in balancing a million dollar budget to date," said finance chairman John Elliott as he presented Mr. Pope's 6-month statement.
Mr. Pope said he hesitates to be optimistic in view of certain increases in expenditure not anticipated when the budget was set.
"But if expenditures are rigidly controlled it could be possible to break even by year-end," he said.

Possibility of extending sewer to a group of six houses on eastern Guelph St. will be considered.
George Couling and Frank Carter, who asked about this were told that they should present a petition from residents. The sewers would be installed as a local improvement.

District weed inspector Howard Henry, who had recently addressed council about weed control, wrote that he was satisfied with the town cutting operation but that he thinks a weed inspector should be employed by the day next year rather than expecting a man to do this after his normal day's work.

Replying to town correspondence about complaints by Normal resident Ray Pomeroy that raw sewage is entering the Credit River, the Ontario Water Resources Commission said it is investigating.

The planning committee was asked to study the question of boarding houses in reference to a house on Main St. N.
The zoning administrator feels boarding houses are only allowed in R4 areas and that in R2. But he should study the technicality so he can be sure of his ground," said Mayor Hyde.
