Auto Workers' Union Endorses New Party Foreign Policy

George Burt, Canadian Director of UAW, last week issued the following statement:

The Canadian UAW Council, made up of 135 delegates representing the unions' 65,000 Canadian members enthusiastically endorsed the foreign policy statement recently adopted by the National Committee for the New Party.

**Withdrawal**  
At a quarterly session marking the fifth anniversary of its \$250,000 education centre here, the council said it took the action partly to prevent an interpretation of neutrality being placed on its previous foreign policy stand. The action taken over the weekend puts the UAW in favour of withdrawal from NATO and in qualitative support of NATO as well as for recognition of Red China.

In another action supporting recent Canadian Labour Congress policy, the council urged that Canada join the Organization of American States. Trade union experience in ORIT, the western hemisphere section of the International Confederation of Free Trade Unions, was behind the proposal. George Burt, Canadian UAW director, explained Burt has represented the UAW in ORIT meetings.
