WHAT COUNCIL DID

Urges Civil Defence Measures Immediately

A strong plea for organization of a local civil defence group was made to council on Monday by George Aspden, 16 Mary St.

Mr. Aspden, who said he had been active in such work during the war and later in Metro Toronto urged council to take definite action in view of present world tension.

"I first broached this subject four years ago and nothing has been done since then," he said.

"Could any councillor tell the public what to do in a national emergency?" was the question he posed as he urged immediate action.

Seek County Advice

Mayor Hyde said that Halton has a county coordinator's office in Milton and that Mr. Aspden's remarks would be forwarded for his consideration.

Reeve Sargent pointed out that the county has organized medical and welfare branches, police and firemen, and that once this has been done he believes the next step will be to have organizations in individual communities as Mr. Aspden suggests.

Thinks Top Level

It was the opinion of Cr. Cass that a town like Georgetown could not handle the matter and that coordination at top level is a necessity.

"We should bring pressure on senior governments for action," he said. "We are not here in interest, but in direction."

We have recently been informed by the Canadian Jersey Cattle Club that at a Jersey Sale known as the International Invitational Sale held in Robstown, Texas, not long ago, the highest selling Canadian animal was Rock-Ella Dreamer's Noble, a cow consigned by Kenneth Ella & Sons of Hornby in Halton County, which sold for \$900.00.

The Ella's also sold the yearling heifer, Rock-Ella's Aerie Patsy for \$425.00.

Alibert Robinson, who is judging Jerseys at the Canadian National Exhibition and who attended the sale, says that no animal created a more favourable comment than did Rock-Ella Dreamer's Noble, purchased by Daypet Jersey Farm in Missouri.

The average prices at the sale were low as attendance was small. Otherwise Rock-Ella Dreamer's Noble could easily have reached the two thousand dollar mark, reports Judge Robinson.

Bell's School Reverts To Old Owners

History reversed itself this week when the Burlington Board of Education ordered the Bell School west of Milton sold to Mrs. Georgina Bell, a great-granddaughter of the man who sold the school site to the old Nelson school board in 1855.

Abraham Bell, one of Halton's early settlers, sold the school site on the corner of 10 sidersoad and the Bell's Line for 12 pounds, 10 shillings. His descendant offered \$800. The sale is subject to a release document signed by other descendants of the original owner of the land.

Under the terms of the 1855 sale, the school board was obligated to offer the ground to the heirs when the school was no longer required. It is Burlington's last one room school.
