Trucks Collide in Fog Estimate \$100 Damage

Two trucks creeping in opposite directions through a blanketing fog met head-on early Tuesday morning. However their low rate of speed kept damage to the vehicles under \$100.

The O.P.P. officer who made the investigation, Cst. Haines, said that the trucks, a 1955 GMC, panel driven by Rudolph Henousek of R.R. 1, Acton, and a 1949 International stake truck driven by Donald McIntyre of R.R. 1, Acton, collided at a bend in the road near the town-line. He estimated damage at \$65. to the Henousek truck and \$30. to McIntyre.

The trucks were not traveling fast enough to cause injury.
