Night School is Offering Twenty Courses This Year

Georgetown Night School is offering twenty courses covering a wide range of subjects this fall and included in the curriculum is a new feature which will make available several short courses spread over seven classes. The short courses are scheduled to terminate before Christmas, however, it will be the pupils prerogative to vote the classes be extended into the second half of the term if they create enough interest.

The regular courses will consist of 14 two-hour long lessons which will be given on Tuesdays or Wednesdays, first classes to be held on October 17th and 18th at 8 p.m. Night School will recess for the Christmas season from November 29th until January 9th. The courses will windup on Feb. 21st.

Application Forms
Short courses will consist of 7 two-hour long lessons starting on the same dates and ending with the regular mid-term recess. A minimum of fifteen applicants must apply for each class to make it feasible. Application forms are available at the Herald and in this week's Night School ad.

In the Needlecraft course instruction in all lines of fancy work, needlepoint, crocheting, knitting, etc. is given.
The Picture Frames course is quite original and will consist of making and finishing new frames and also the refinishing of old frames.
Square Dancing This class was actively enjoyed two years ago. It will be taught on Wednesday evening every other week and the committee anticipate a large enrollment.

Keep Fit Men and Women This will be physical fitness taught by Mrs. Ray, emphasis on badminton coaching if any couples are interested.
Beginner's Sewing Instructor Mrs. R. Hess. Pupils are taught the operation of the machine, basic steps re fitting and altering patterns. Blouses and skirts are made.
The Dressmaking Course is taught by Mrs. C. Stewart. This course is for the advanced student.
Children's Clothing and Dressmaking is taught by Mrs. Harry Moss. Her students may sew for themselves or for their small fry.
The sewing courses are all ways filled and applications should be made early.
The Oil Painting classes are very popular each year. They consist of drawing in black and white, painting in oils and water colour. Classes are both Tuesday and Wednesday nights. Pupils are welcome either night. Instructors are Mrs. Dorothy Stone and Mr. Frank Black.

Full Docket at Court 74 Face Magistrate
Anyone doubting that Georgetown's eight man police department is justifying its number needed only to sit in a magistrate's court Monday afternoon to have their uncertainties rapidly dispersed.

Stated to come before Magistrate Kenneth A. Langford from the local department were seventy-four cases making one of the heaviest court dockets since the department came into being. Twenty-four of the total had to be remanded to future court dates.

Under Age Ten more charges for failing to stop at through streets were of the remaining cases. Four also upheld. Eleven charges under convictions were registered under the Liquor Control Act. Freak Collision Occurs On Dusty County Road

A dusty road led to a freak collision west of town Monday in which damage was estimated at \$1,450.

According to O.P.P. the accident occurred on the 8th Line at about 1:50 p.m. and involved a tractor driven by Kenneth Kirkwood of Main St. Georgetown, a haler which was in tow and a 1959 International dump truck driven by Gerald John Lawrence of Harrison. The farm vehicles were travelling south on the line at a slow rate of speed and when passed by another vehicle, became completely enveloped in a billow of dust. The driver of the International followed the tractor and haler until right on top of them. He swerved his truck sharply left but piled into the machinery.
Cst Tom Duly of the county detachment O.P.P. said damage was about \$1,200 to the tractor and haler and \$250 to the dump truck. There were no injuries.
