## Larger Schools, Buses Modern Education Trend

The little red school house is rapidly disappearing in this better school take their place and our children are transported from the small rural sections to the large schools by buses which drive up and down side roads and concessions to pick up the youngsters in the morning and return them again at night.

It means a very long day for most of the children who have to leave very early in the morning and arrive home just in time for supper. Just in time for supper, do their homework and early to bed as they have to rise so early in the morning. This leaves little time for home life for our children. It emphasizes the importance of those first few years before the children are school age as the only chance for home training, aside from school holidays for the majority of our transported students.

There is a good example of the changed school system. Our little old school used to be the centre of learning for all public school children in the Norval district. Now, as part of Norval lies in Peel county and part in Halton, the children must attend the school in the county where their parents pay their taxes. Thus children on the Peel side of the town line must go to the new Bramtonville Public School by bus, although some live within walking distance of the Norval School and those on the Halton side go to Norval Public School. Children from near Terra Cott and Norval Station are brought by bus to Norval and because of overcrowding Norval grade 8 go by the same bus to Scarborough Public School. There is also the Roman Catholic bus which picks up the children who attend the separate school in Georgetown and the Dutch Reform bus transports the Dutch children to their school in Brampton.

Besides all these public school buses we also have two high school buses, one to take our teen agers who live on the Peel side of the road to Streetsville High School and those in Halton to Georgetown High School. This makes a total of six school buses going their different ways each day. Paid for with the taxpayers money.
