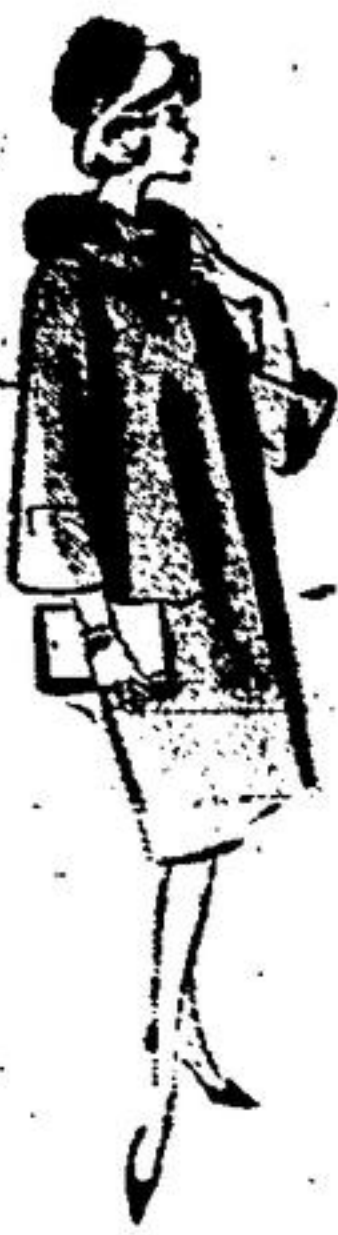

## Hare-Raising in Glen Williams....

### Br'er Rabbit Vies for a Place at the Dinner Table



Does "rabbit pie" conjure up visions of the England of Dickens time? with a fleeting glimpse of Tiny Tim edifying the picture?

No longer need this duplicity be limited to imagination, Bill McGowan, of Glen Williams, is raising rabbits, and selling them like hot rabbit pies.

Mr. McGowan is trying to create a domestic rabbit market. He feels that with the influx of people from other countries, who are used to eating rabbit, it shouldn't be too hard.

His New Zealand white rabbits are all fed the best concentrated foods, and their pens kept scrupulously clean. "They taste close to turkey, or chicken," he claims, "but are not so dry."

No, you housewives don't have to clean them. They come all skinned, cleaned, cut up, and packaged, weighing about three pounds. For you novices, there is a pamphlet which accompanies it, with instructions in different methods of preparing. Mr. McGowan thinks the most popular is the pot pie, according to his steady customers.

Not a man to miss an opportunity, he is exploring the possibility of selling the skins. By a system of division, he hopes to keep the multiplication under control. An ideal yield, he feels, would be about 8 baby rabbits, five times a year. Theoretically, a doe, (the female rabbit) could produce twelve times a year. This sounds like a "hare-raising" experience.

If the present trend continues, and the customers keep coming back, a freezing plant will be added.

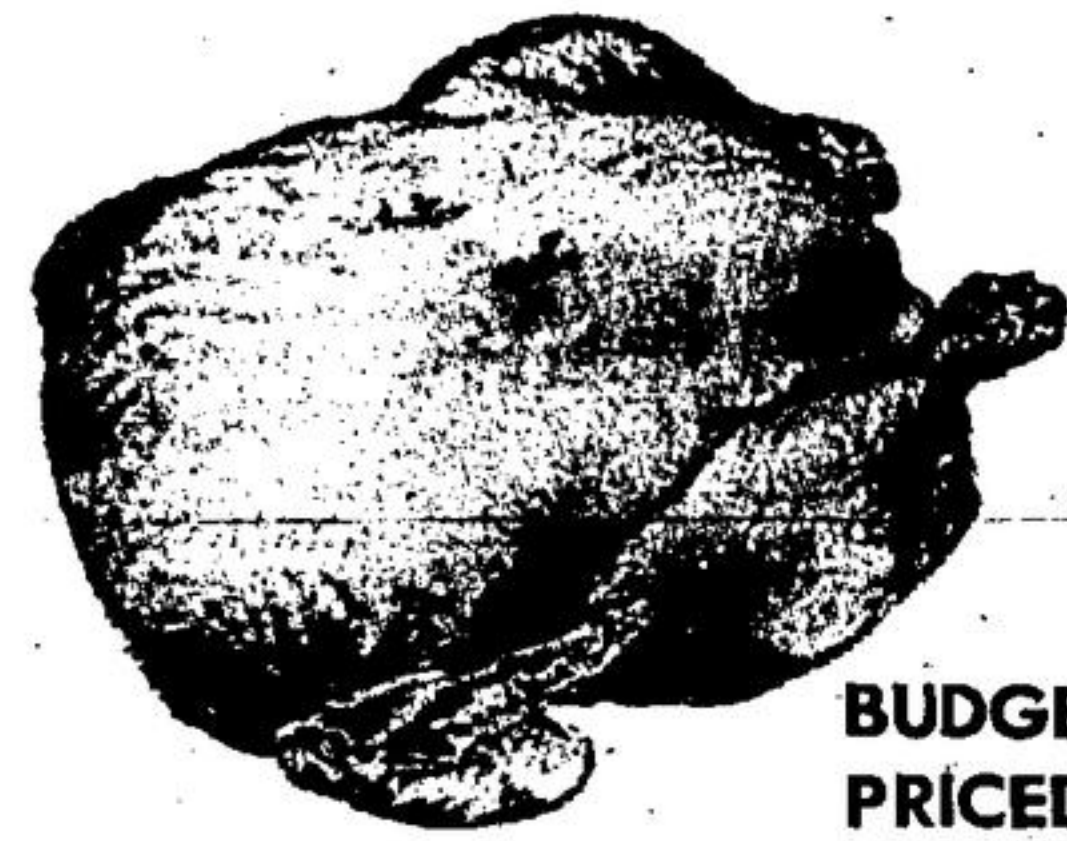
