Plane Crash Kills Founder Varian Associates

The co-founder of Varian Associates Ltd., which has a plant here, Sigurd F. Varian, 60, was killed in a private plane crash in Mexico, his office was informed Saturday.

He was flying a two engine plane from Guadalajara to Puerto Vallarta, his family said, when he crashed into the Pacific about a mile off shore.

A companion, George Applegate, swam ashore. Dr. Varian's body was washed up on the beach. Dr. Varian was one of the first pilots sent to Mexico when Pan American Airways began flights to Mexico and Central America.

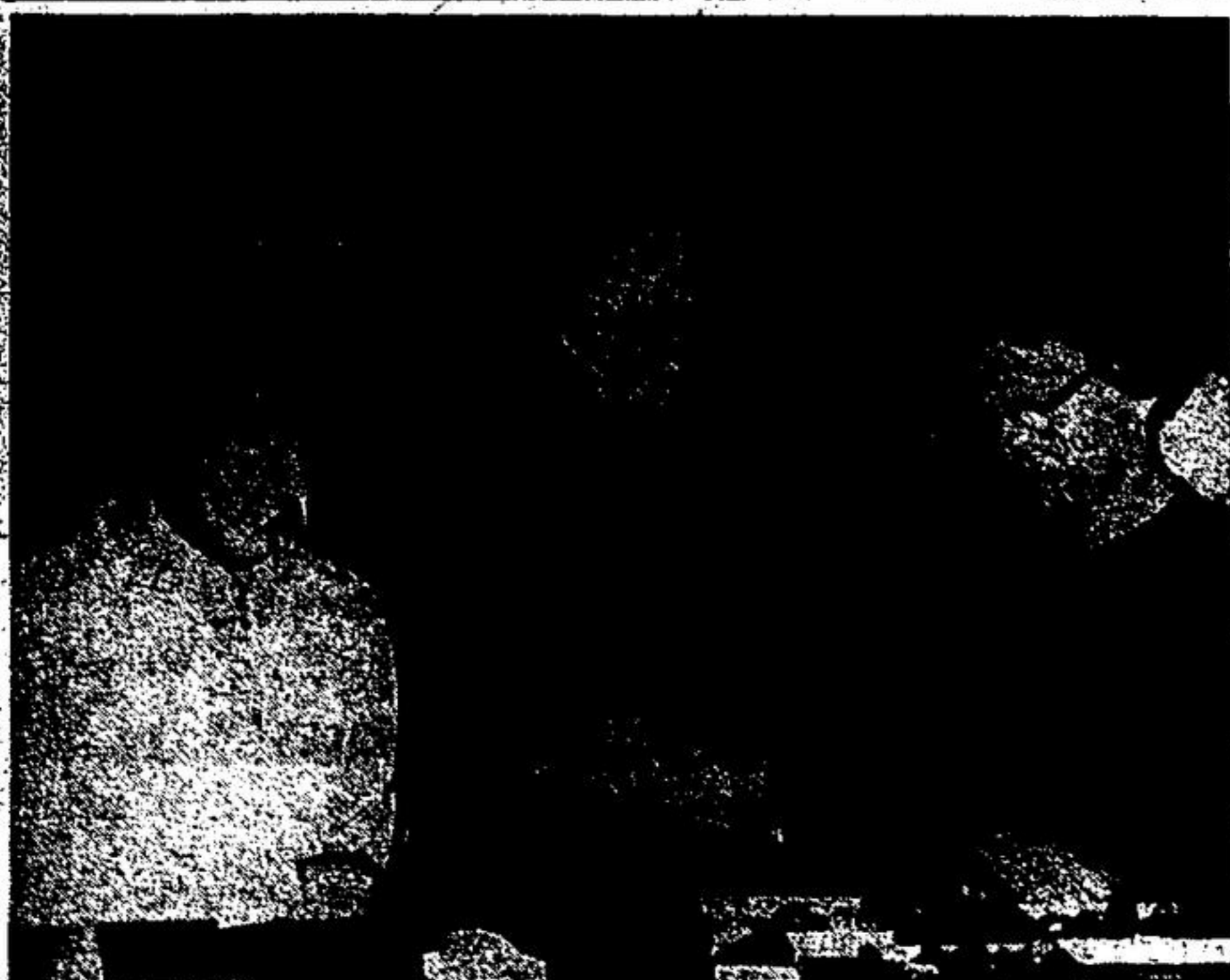
Public skating started at the John St. arena Tuesday night when 251 adults and children tested their skating legs on the new surface.
