Slight Damage Grounds Gyroplane Temporarily

The prototype Avian 2-180 is back in its birthplace again, but only temporarily.

The Avian was damaged at Waterloo Wellington airport last Thursday when the canopy opened in the air during a slight test and returned to the Georgetown plant for repairs. An investigation revealed that a locking pin had been inadvertently left out of the canopy safety position. It will undergo a complete inspection during the grounding.

Avian spokesman Gordon Sampson told the Herald that flight tests will resume as soon as possible. He said the gyroplane has made 31 flight tests to date.

Highbridge

Following their marriage at Highbridge on April 16th, 1907, Mr. and Mrs. Hancock came to Canada and farmed at Lot 9, 3rd Line West Chinguacousy, until 1913 when they moved to Lot 17, concession 6 west. She was a member of Union Presbyterian Church and belonged to the WMS of the church.

Mrs. Hancock leaves her husband, seven children, Mrs. H. Slayner (Helen), Joseph, Mrs. W. McCutcheon (May), Thomas and Mrs. G. Gilmer (Ivy) of Toronto, Herbert and Charles of Glen Williams; 23 grandchildren; and 5 great-grandchildren; and brother and sisters Jesse Salvige, Mrs. J. Gould, Mrs. J. Miller, Mrs. W. Torrington and Lily and Florence Salvidge. She was predeceased by a daughter Florence in 1932, a sister Bertie and brothers James, Bert, and Edward, the latter killed in World War I.

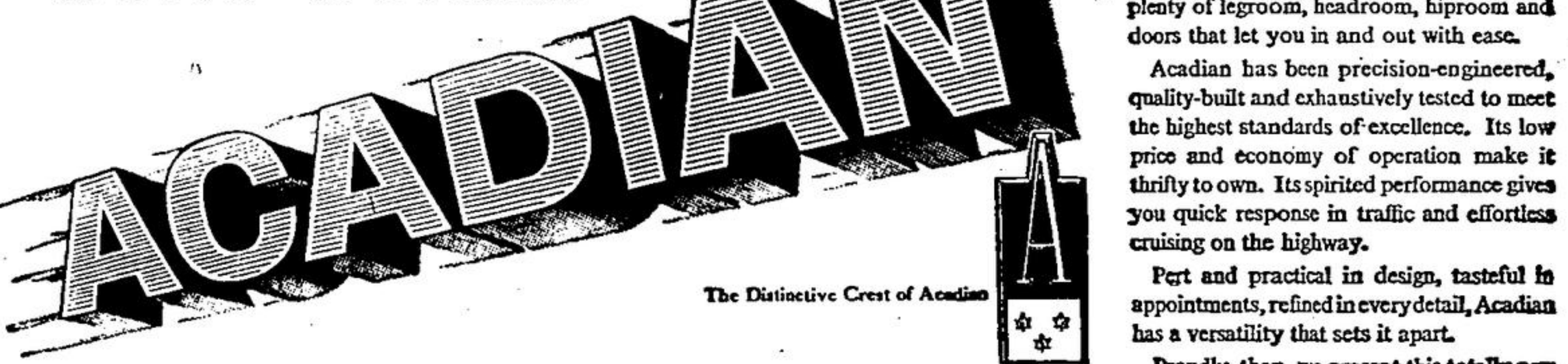
