Hospital Affairs Are Community Business

Since the inception of the Ontario Hospital Services Commission and the Insurance Plan, many persons have taken for granted that because the government controls some aspects of hospital operations, the hospital is no longer under community ownership. This is just not the case. Hospitals still belong to the community, are built by the people in the community and every citizen of that community has the right to say how it will function.

Government has always had some control of hospital operation, under the terms of the British North America Act health and education are the responsibility and prerogative of each of the various provinces. In order to provide assurance that health care was properly carried out there have been in existence over many years Acts and Regulations which specify very clearly the responsibilities and authorities under which hospitals function.

Among other sections of the Ontario Hospital Act is one which states that every hospital must be managed by a board which is elected or appointed in accordance with the provisions of the authority whereby the hospital is created, established or incorporated.

In the case of the Georgetown and District Memorial Hospital it was incorporated under the hospital registration act as a Public General Hospital and therefore its purpose is to treat all illnesses or diseases which are not chronic, contagious or mental.

It was built by the members of the community with funds donated by individuals and through government grants which are a part of general revenue from tax.

Every resident who meets the requirements under the by-laws may attend the annual meeting of the hospital association at which they may nominate or elect a representative to the board of directors. The powers of the board of directors are varied and the attending physician and staff should be heavy as compared to other hospitals.

The members of the board of directors are responsible to the community and to the hospital. They must ensure that the hospital is run in the best interests of the community and that the funds are used in the most efficient manner possible.
